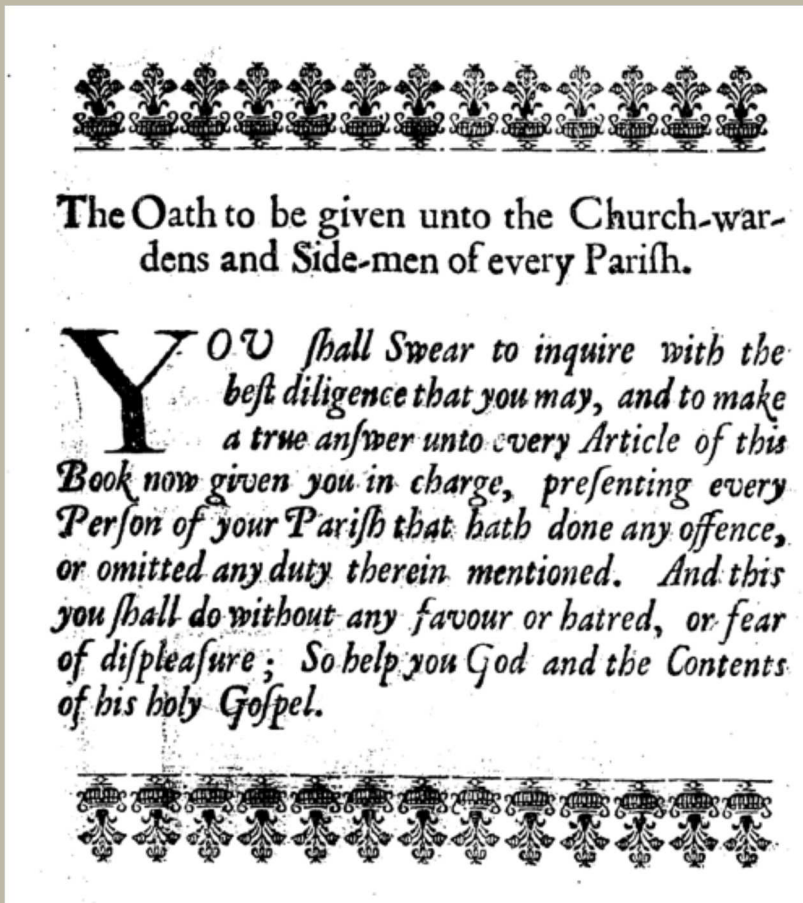


Churchwardens Accounts, c. 1400-1800: Where Next?
